# ENTRY AND SEEDING INFORMATION

## **Northern California Regional**

The Central Coast Section (CCS), North Coast Section (NCS), Northern Section (NS), Oakland Section (OS), Sac-Joaquin Section (SJS), and San Francisco Section (SFS) will participate in the CIF Northern California Regional Tournament. The CCS, NCS and SJS will have two automatic entries in each of the five divisions; the NS will have two automatic entries in Divisions II-V; the OS will have two automatic berths in Division I; the SFS will have two automatic berths and their entries will be placed into their respective enrollment division.

## **Southern California Regional**

The San Diego Section (SDS), Los Angeles Section (LAS), Southern Section (SS) and the Central Section (CS) will participate in the CIF Southern California Regional. Division I will be a 16-team bracket. The CS and SDS will have two automatic entries in each of the five divisions. The SS will have eight automatic entries in Division I and four automatic entries in Divisions II-V. The LAS will have four automatic entries in Division I and two automatic entries in Division II. The LAS will also have two (2) entries representing their "small schools" divisional playoffs and the teams will be placed into their respective enrollment divisions.

The regional seeding meeting will take place on **Sunday, March 8, 2009**. The seeding committee shall be composed of the section commissioners or their designees and the regional tournament director who will chair the meeting. Competition among the teams in each gender will be held in five enrollment divisions, previously determined by the CIF's divisional classification system. Each gender will be divided into 16-team, 10-team bracket, 9-team bracket or 8-team brackets depending on the number of automatic entries as previously described. Entries will be determined by the CIF Section.

The seeding committee will take all reasonable action to ensure that section champions receive a home game in the first round, however the integrity of the tournament will take precedent. .

# TICKET POLICY/ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

## PRELIMINARY ROUNDS

Schools will receive one information packet with tournament guidelines, and other regional playoff information for the preliminary rounds (I, II & Semi's) of the playoffs from their section commissioner. Schools advancing to the Regional Finals will receive their information packet at the end of the semifinal round game.

**Ticket prices for regional first, second and regional semi-final round contests are as follows:**

### Single Contest

### Doubleheaders

Children under 5, when accompanied by an adult, shall be admitted free of charge.

**Tickets – CIF “DOES NOT” supply tickets for home site contests. Host schools will use their own tickets for admission. Host schools will be accountable for proper bookkeeping.** Please use separate colored number tickets for adults and students, which will provide the necessary information for the Box Office Ticket Control Sheet.

**Gate List-** Each participating school shall develop a “gate list.” Gate lists are limited to the following:

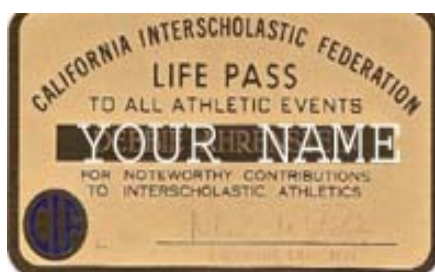
- 1) Traveling team with 20 including 15 team members, coaches and stat keepers.
  - 2) 10 spirit squad members and one advisor, 12 pep band members and one school supervisor.
- The visiting team shall ensure that the host school receives its gate list in a timely manner. All others, including bus drivers, drill team members, non-varsity players, etc. must purchase tickets and enter the contest through the regular ticket access doors.

**Passes** - The CIF Gold Life Pass and the 2008-09 State CIF Courtesy Card entitle the bearer and one guest admission to the game. 2008-09 Section Media passes and media passes from the California Prep Sports Writer's Association (CPSWA) entitle the bearer to admission. **No CIF section, league, faculty, booster club, or student pass will be honored for admission.** (Please see below samples of the three acceptable passes). NO other Section Passes will be honored at State Tournament Events.

# **GAME ADMINISTRATION – PRELIMINARY ROUNDS**

**Recommended Minimum Seating/Gyms** -The recommended minimum permanent seating requirements needed to host first, second and regional semi-final round contests are as follows:

<u>Division</u>	<u>First Round</u>	<u>Second Round</u>
I	1200-1,400	1500-1,800
II	1200-1,400	1500-1,800
III	1000-1,200	1200-1,400
IV	600-1,000	800-1,200
V	400-900	600-1,400

When anticipated attendance will exceed the capacity of the host school's facility, it shall be the prerogative of the tournament director to direct the host school to arrange a suitable alternate site and provide game management. (The tournament director can also lower the recommended seating capacity based upon the factors listed below.) **All facility rental costs must have the prior approval of the tournament director.** The tournament director will make the final determination based upon several factors including but not limited to: past ticket sales, tickets sales at section playoffs and historical following. Section commissioners, working with tournament management, may recommend lower minimum requirements for certain contests.

- Teams may not leave school on the day preceding the game prior to the close of the school day unless they have petitioned the State CIF office for an additional travel day.
- Host schools must hold one-half of the total available seats open and unoccupied for visiting team rooters until 15 minutes prior to scheduled tip-off unless the site administrators of the participating schools have agreed otherwise.
- Teams (host and visitor) will NOT be allowed on the floor earlier than 90 minutes prior to a single game or before the first game of a doubleheader. If the host school schedules practice time in that 90 minute block, they shall make an equal amount of time available to the visiting team.

**NFHS Rules / Game Ball** - All contests will be played under the 2008-09 National Federation Basketball Rules with California modifications, except where superceded by the State CIF Constitution or this handbook. The CIF's official ball is the Spalding Top Flite 1000; CIF regional and championship games will be played with the composite ball.

**Bench/Officials Scorer and Clock Operators** - For first, second and regional semi-final round contests, the assignment of team benches and the seating of rooting sections, pep bands, etc. shall be the responsibility of the host school. The host school is also responsible for securing trained adults as scorers, game clock operators and shot clock operators who shall function as game officials, and an announcer.

**Uniforms** –The **HOME** team will wear white uniforms. The **VISITING** team will wear dark uniforms. Each participating school may suit up no more than 15 players who must wear their high school uniform. No other uniform attire may be worn for the entire time beginning with the warm-ups through the completion of the awards ceremony. **NOTE: The wearing of sweat suits, T-shirts, or any other clothing representing any organization, corporation, business, college or university is strictly prohibited.**

**Announcer** -The starting line-ups from each team shall be introduced on an alternating basis, beginning with the visiting team. Players in pairs shall meet at half-court, shake hands, and return to their respective foul lines. See appendix for script.

**Supervision of Cheering Sections / Bands / Posters / Halftimes** - Individuals designated by the site administrators of the involved schools shall supervise student cheering sections and pep bands. Electronic equipment and noisemakers, such as air horns, bells, drums, sirens, blow horns, thunder sticks etc. will not be allowed. Only cheerleaders in uniforms may use megaphones.

- Each participating school will be permitted a three-minute performance between halves with the visiting team taking the floor first. Pep bands must be seated in the school's rooting section. The band may play before the beginning of the contest, during time-outs, and at half time. Band instruments may not be used as noisemakers.
- Only positive banners and spirit signs may be displayed at State CIF contests.
- The visiting school's athletic director shall contact the hosting school's athletic director to coordinate pre-game planning including supervision and gate lists.

**Officials** - The Basketball Officials Assignment Committee, working in concert with the CIF Staff, will assign game officials for all CIF playoff games. Home school site directors are to pay a game fee of \$65.00 to each of the three assigned officials. Names of the officials shall be called into the host school. If you have not received the names by 12 noon, they may be obtained from Al Goldberg at the State CIF Office, (510) 521-4447. State CIF will be responsible for reimbursing game officials for all other allowable expenses.

**Game Management Expenses** – All host schools are given a blanket amount for the basic expenses of hosting a basketball contest. These include the site director, announcer, school supervision and security, custodians, timers, scorer, ticket sellers and ticket takers. The following is the game staff payment schedule by divisions:

Division I and II - \$250.00

Division III and IV - \$225.00

Division V - \$200.00

**Additional Security** - Some games need more security than can be covered by the above allotted amounts. Schools with greater security needs **must immediately contact the tournament director for pre-approval of additional expenses**. The CIF will reimburse schools for those approved greater security needs, minus \$100.00, assumed in the above amounts. **The CIF is unable to reimburse schools without pre-approval from the tournament director.**

**Game Score Reporting** - **Game scores must be reported to the STATE CIF Office at 510-521-4447** (please identify yourself when reporting the score) within 15 minutes of the conclusion of the contest and to your local newspaper (all calls must be completed no later than 10pm). **ARCO Arena** is located at One Sports Parkway, Sacramento CA 95814 – 916-928-0000, located near the intersection of Interstate 5 and Del Paso Road. Team members and others on the approved gate list should enter the arena parking lot at Gate 9 and enter the arena through the southeast corner security entrance.

#### ARCO Advance Ticket Sales

As a convenience to the public, advance tickets will be on sale at the ARCO Arena Box Office and TicketMaster, beginning **February 9, 2009**. Tickets may also be purchased on the day of the contest at the ARCO Arena Box Office. Tickets will be sold for each of the three sessions at the following prices:

Except for Kings Row I & II and Courtside Rows AA-EE, **ALL** seats in the arena are **GENERAL ADMISSION**

**Passes** - The CIF Gold Life Pass and the 2008-09 State CIF Courtesy Card entitle the bearer and one guest admission to the game when presented to the box office will-call window. All media must contact Emmy Zack for credentials **NO LATER THAN TUESDAY, MARCH 10, 2009** at 12 noon. Media Press Credential applications are available on the State CIF web site, [www.cifstate.org/media](http://www.cifstate.org/media)

**NO CIF section, league, faculty, booster club, or student pass will be honored for admission.**

**Parking Fee:** At ARCO Arena there will be a \$12.00 parking fee for ALL cars and busses.

## **INFORMATION FOR THE HEAD COACH AND ATHLETIC ADMINISTRATOR FOR ARCO ARENA**

### **Arrival Time/Arrival Information**

Please arrive at the game site approximately 1½ hours before game time and check in with the tournament director. (Please note that if you are playing the first game of the day the arena will open only one hour before game time and no team will be allowed on the arena floor until ½ hour before game time). Busses should enter the arena parking lot at gate 9; unload in front of the arena and be directed where to park. You will enter ARCO Arena through the lower southeast corner security gate. The athletic director, the head coach, the two designated assistant coaches, your roster of (up to) 15 players and a trainer will be on the pass gate list and do not need tickets for entry. The bus driver, other coaches, any other attending adults, and team followers will need tickets to attend the contests and must enter the arena through the upstairs entrances. All bags, backpacks, purses, etc. will be thoroughly checked by ARCO security personnel at the pass gate entrance. Coaches and trainers will be given participant badges which should be worn at all times while on the arena floor and in the locker room area. You will be met at the entrance gate by your team host who will show you to your locker room/dressing area, the media room and answer any specific question(s) you might have. Please supervise your student-athletes the entire time they are in the arena.

### **Squad Size**

Squad size is limited to 20, including 15 players in uniform, coaches, trainers and stats keepers. Awards will be given to only the fifteen players on the official roster. **PLEASE DON'T ASK FOR EXCEPTIONS.**

### **Benches**

The CIF will make every effort to have 22 seats in the bench area, 15 in the front row and 7 in a second row. **NO UNIFORMED PLAYER MAY SIT ON THE FLOOR. NO MORE THAN FIVE (5) COACHES MAY SIT IN THE FRONT ROW ALLOWING 10 UNIFORMED PLAYERS IN THE FRONT ROW. ANY ADDITIONAL UNIFORMED PLAYERS WILL SIT IN THE SECOND ROW PRIOR TO ANY ADULT.** If the schools travel/bench party exceeds 22, then the uniformed student-athletes will take precedent for all 22 seats.

### **Home Team/Visiting Team & Dressing Rooms**

**Home Team – Higher Seeded Teams;** white jerseys; east bench; **boys** dressing rooms will be on the southeast corner of the arena; **girls** dressing rooms will be on the west side of the arena (through west tunnel). Team host will lead teams to proper dressing rooms and provide assistance.

**Visiting Team – Lower Seeded Teams;** dark colored jerseys; west bench; **boys & girls** dressing rooms will be on the west side of the arena (through west tunnel). Team host will lead teams to proper dressing rooms and provide assistance.

(Note: If a team has only one set of jerseys, it will be their responsibility to notify their opponent and the tournament director so that arrangements can be made.) Towels / locks **ARE NOT** provided.

**Please remember that there is no full-time supervision of the locker room / dressing facilities; you should make arrangements for safeguarding your valuables.**

### **Cheering / Rooting Sections**

**Higher Seeded Teams (Home)** – Sections 121(Girls games) & 120(Boys games) – located above the east tunnel entrance to the arena floor.

**Lower Seeded Teams (Visitors)** – Sections 109(Girls games) & 108(Boys games) – located above the west tunnel entrance to the arena floor.

### **Sportsmanship Meeting**

The **head coach, two captains, school administrator** in charge and **pep squad advisor** shall attend the **mandatory sportsmanship meeting** in the CIF Headquarters Office at the southeast corner of the arena (where you entered the arena). It will begin promptly, 45 minutes before the first contest (9:15 AM) and at the beginning of the (3<sup>rd</sup>) quarter of the preceding game for all succeeding games.

### **Uniform Requirements**

All athletes competing in the championships must wear their high school uniforms. Uniforms of all team members must be identical. No other uniform may be worn at any time the team is on the arena floor, from the warm-ups through the completion of the awards ceremony. **The wearing of sweatshirts, t-shirts or any clothing representing any organization, corporation or business, college or university is strictly prohibited and may result in disqualification. Corporate logos that are manufactured into the uniform must be worn within the dimensions allowed by National Federation basketball rules.**

### **Practice at the Tournament Site**

Teams participating in the CIF Basketball Championships will not be permitted to practice at the tournament site prior to or during the tournament. For the first game of the day, teams will be allowed to take the floor 30 minutes prior to game time. For all other games, teams will be allowed on court immediately following the awards session of the prior game and will be given a full 15-minute warm-up period. Teams arriving late on the floor may not receive their full 15-minutes. Please respect your opponent's space and stay in your own half of the court. This prohibition includes any preliminary round contest played at an alternate home/gym site.

### **Team Introductions**

Prior to the start of each contest team introductions will be made. The visiting team's non-starters will be introduced first, followed by the home team's non-starters. Players will take a position at the foul line area in front of their bench as their names are announced. The starting line up from each team will then be introduced on an alternating basis. Players in pairs, one from each team, will meet at the mid-court area, shake hands, and return to their respective foul lines. **At the conclusion of the introductions, teams that "huddle up" prior to tip-off must do so at their foul line, not in the center court area.**

### **Halftime**

Halftime will be 15 minutes and follow this format: Visiting Team Cheer Squad – 3 minutes / Home team Cheer Squad – 3 minutes / CIF Sponsorship Activities – 4 minutes / Team Warm Up – 5 minutes.

### **Awards Ceremony**

Teams are asked to return to their seats immediately following the end of the game for the awards ceremony beginning with the Pursuing Victory With Honor<sup>sm</sup> Award. This will be followed by the awards ceremony for the runner-up team; medals will be awarded to members of the team who will individually come to half court, followed by the awarding of the runner-up trophy to the head coach. Individual members of the championship team will then be asked to come to half court to receive their medals, followed by the presentation of the championship trophy to the head coach. The championship team will then be asked to remain in the mid-court area for a team picture.

### Nets

The nets are **NOT** to be cut down at the end of each championship game.

### Sportsmanship Award

The CIF may recognize one player from each team with a sportsmanship award and this will be part of the post game ceremony.

### Post Game Media Interviews

**Runner Up Team** - Immediately following the awards ceremony, your host will escort the team and coaches to the media room for press interviews. Interviews will last approximately 10 minutes and will be conducted in group fashion. **Encourage your student-athletes to be positive during media interviews.**

# GENERAL INFORMATION FOR CHEERING SECTIONS & SPIRIT SQUADS

## Location/Supervision

Each school must provide faculty supervisors for its respective student section who will be responsible for maintaining the integrity of their students. All faculty supervisors are to report to the facility at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the game for review of student seating areas and beginning supervisory duties. Please list your rooting section supervisors on the School Information Sheet/Pass Gate List.

- Electronic noisemakers, air horns, drums, bells, sirens, thunder sticks, etc. will not be allowed anywhere in the gym/arena. **The cheering section must be supervised at all times by a supervisor appointed by the school administrator.**
- The school principal shall attend the pre-game sportsmanship meeting and will be considered by CIF officials as the school administrator in charge. Adults sitting in or near your cheering section supporting your school are your responsibility. Please be proactive in controlling your school's cheering section and maintain the aisles open and clear at all times. Most schools find it helpful to have at least one supervisor standing on the gym/arena floor facing their cheering section while other supervisors sit in the assigned section.
- Please also monitor your school's supporters as they exit the gym/arena after the contest. For the regional and state finals the rooting section must be vacated immediately following the awards ceremony so that the next schools cheering sections may be seated.

## Banners/Posters/Stickers

Only positive spirit signs, posters, and banners may be used at the site of State CIF contests and then only in the cheering section area. All banners must be fireproof. No references to an opponent, either directly or indirectly, may be made. Banners or posters are not allowed on any walls in the arena, nor may tape of any kind be used in the facility. Banners, posters and spirit signs must be approved by the cheering section supervisor.

- Banners and posters for games played at ARCO Arena and Pauley Pavilion may only be hung on the rail in front of your cheering section. No stickers of any kind may be used in the arena.

## Bands

Up to 12 members of the school's pep band, and their faculty supervisor, whose names have been submitted by their school's principal will be admitted to the arena at the appropriate security entrance (see regional site info for participant entrance info). Schools with more than 12 members of their pep band must purchase tickets for those extra band members who must enter the arena through the public entrance. School bands shall go directly to their school's assigned cheering section but shall refrain from playing their musical instruments except during the following time periods: from the time their team takes the floor for warm-ups until the beginning of pre-game introductions, during time-outs, at half time (unless the opponent's spirit squad is performing on the arena floor), and at the end of the game before the beginning of the awards ceremony. School pep bands may not use electronic instruments, nor may musical instruments be used as "noisemakers" for cheering purposes. They must be supervised at all times by the band supervisor.

## Student Photographer

One school student photographer, designated in advance by the school principal and listed on the school's gate list as a member of the school's newspaper or yearbook staff, will be admitted to the gym/arena. No other commercial photographers are allowed to take school photos at any State CIF event. Please respect the CIF's contractual agreements.

### **Spirit Squads**

Up to ten members of a school's spirit squad in full uniform, and their faculty supervisor, designated in advance by their school's principal, will be admitted free to the gym/arena. Spirit squad members must come dressed in their uniform. To ensure fairness, schools with more than ten spirit squad members must purchase tickets, even if they are in uniform. They must go immediately to their school's designated cheering section and remain there until their team takes the floor for warm-ups. They will then be allowed to lead cheers from the arena floor area in front of their cheering section. **Spirit squads must be supervised at all times.**

- **Halftime Performances** – During the regional finals each school's spirit squad will be permitted 3 minutes to perform at the beginning of the halftime. The visiting team's spirit squad will perform first followed by the home team's spirit squad.
- **Megaphones** – Non-electric megaphones may be used by spirit squad members only and only while facing their school's cheering section and leading cheers.

### **Sportsmanship**

All representatives of CIF member schools must remember that the number one priority of high school athletics is good sportsmanship. Everyone in the school's cheering section, faculty supervisors, students, parents, the pep band and spirit squad, and other team followers, must adhere to the CIF's Pursuing Victory with Honor<sup>sm</sup>.

- It is the responsibility of the school administration and faculty supervisors to ensure that school supporters exhibit appropriate behavior.

### **Security Gate Entry**

In accordance with security requirements all bags will be searched in the pass gate area before the spirit squad, pep band and others can be escorted to their cheering section.

Each school participating in the regional finals on Saturday March 14, 2009 MUST complete the **SCHOOL INFORMATION SHEET/PASS GATE LIST** that will be found in the information packet for the finals and fax it to their respective tournament director no later than 12 noon on Friday March 13, 2009.

**The following group limits will be admitted for free. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS. Tickets must be purchased for any additional members of these traveling parties.**

# COMMON REIMBURSEMENT POLICY

## BASKETBALL REGIONAL AND CIF/STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The CIF's reimbursement policy is based on three factors: safety, consistency, and an attempt by the CIF to defray some of the costs associated with participation in these championship events.

### Safety

The most important factor is the safety of student-athletes, their coaches and administrators who travel to CIF-sponsored regional and state championship events. A team that travels a great distance to participate in an evening contest may request an overnight stay if they are unable to safely return to their school site. 150 miles (one way) is the arbitrary distance beyond which a team qualifies for an overnight stay. Some schools may choose to return home after an evening event, even if they are more than 150 miles from the game site, because they feel it is safe to do so. Teams who travel more than 150 miles one-way to a game but play at a time that safely allows them to travel to and from the game site on the same day will not be granted overnight approval.

In some cases it is possible to request reimbursement, even if the one-way miles are less than 150, if the safety of student-athletes is of concern.

### Consistency

Over 180 teams will participate in regional and state championships in basketball this year. The CIF has one policy governing these 180+ schools, not individual policies for each school. The CIF recognizes that all participating schools are governed by different district policies, different travel needs and geographic issues. The CIF policy is flexible enough to account/allow for some of those differences. 150 freeway miles are not the same as 150 mountain miles, for example. **HOWEVER, prior approval must be obtained through the tournament director.**

## REIMBURSEMENT EXPENSES

The CIF reimbursement policy is designed to help defray many of the major costs associated with participation in the basketball regional championships. It is not designed to totally reimburse all schools for all costs, no different than any section playoff in basketball. Schools are reimbursed at the rate approved by the State Federated Council, which is comprised of representatives of all ten sections.

### Traveling Party

Reimbursable expenses for traveling party of basketball teams will be limited to 15 student-athletes and 2 adults. Schools may take additional personnel at their own expense.

### Mileage

The CIF will reimburse participating schools \$1.00/mile, round trip, for ground travel from their school site to the contest site. CSAA (other) computations will be used to determine mileage figures for computation purposes. Schools have the option of choosing a school bus, chartered bus, vans, or private automobiles for their transportation needs but will receive only one \$1.00 per mile reimbursement. Bridge fees and parking fees will also be reimbursed.

- Schools traveling more than 150 miles, one way, to a contest site and who do not stay overnight may request up to an additional \$200.00 reimbursement for the cost of an additional bus driver. This request must be approved in advance by the CIF tournament director and may only be used to help defray the cost of an additional bus driver.

### **Lodging**

Teams traveling more than 150 miles, one way, to a contest and who receive advance approval, may elect to spend the night at the headquarters hotel. No team will be allowed more than one night's lodging. The CIF will reimburse for up to six rooms depending on the size of the official traveling party. Reimbursement is based on three players per room using two beds and one rollaway. Additional rooms are the financial responsibility of the school.

### **Meals**

Teams traveling more than 150 miles, one way, to a contest site and who elect to spend the night at the headquarters hotel or other approved accommodation will qualify for a meal allowance of \$15.00 per member of the official traveling party. Teams traveling more than 150 miles, one way, to a contest site and who elect NOT to spend the night will qualify for a meal allowance of \$7.00 per member of the traveling party. A meal allowance will not be given to a team traveling less than 150 miles, one way.

Schools must complete the Official Statement of Travel and Expense within ten working days of the contest to qualify for reimbursement expenses. The policy outlined above is in effect for all CIF-sponsored basketball contests; preliminary rounds, the regional championships, and the CIF State championships.

## **FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING**

**Report Due Dates** - All financial reports are due within ten (10) days of the contests. These forms must be completed and mailed within the ten (10) day period.

### **Ticket Sales**

In the preliminary rounds I, II, & regional semi-finals the host school shall **supply their own** tickets and will be responsible for all ticket sales.

The host school must fill out the Ticket Control Sheet and the Game Management Form. Both these forms must be sent to the State CIF Office within ten working days of the contest. A net profit check, including all revenues derived from the game after approved expenses, should be made out to the California Interscholastic Federation.

Traveling teams shall completely fill out the Official Statement of Travel and Expense and send to the State CIF within ten working days of the contest.
